Scholarships Abound!

The Greene County Memorial Hospital Foundation is pleased to announce, in addition to the annual medical student scholarship, we have now created nursing scholarships for Greene County residents who intend to acquire their nursing degree and practice in Greene County upon graduation.

There are four, separate \$5,000 nursing scholarships available, (with a few parameters to be eligible). The candidate must be a Greene County resident for at least the past four years and have completed at least one year of an accredited nursing school. Deadline to submit a completed application is May 3, 2010.



As mentioned above, GCMHF is pleased to be able to once again offer a \$25,000 annual scholarship for a Greene County resident enrolled in medical school. This is the second consecutive year the foundation has offered the medical student scholarship. Deadline for submitting the application is also May 3, 2010. Simply call the Foundation office for more information or to obtain an application packet for either of these scholarships.



Lastly, the foundation has continued our relationship with Washington Greene Job Training Agency (WGJTA) and is providing funding for five, \$2,000 scholarships for graduating high school students pursuing a degree in a health care field. The application for these scholarships can be obtained from the high school guidance office, and then in turn submitted back to WGJTA. There is one scholarship available for a student from each of the five Greene County school districts. The deadline for this application is April 30, 2010.
